Veleta Frances Pierce Stutts, 81 of rural Dexter died at home on August 10, 2013.

She was born to Mary Alice Gann Pierce and Jesse Davis Pierce on August 9, 1932 in Blytheville, Arkansas.

She also sang with the Claremore, Oklahoma choir throughout Europe and at New Yorks Carnegie Hall.
