

# Everett T. Leirer

December 4, 1912 - July 21, 2009

Everett T. Leirer, son of the late Otto Leirer and Rosa Pruitt Leirer was born on December 4, 1912 at Greenway, Arkansas and departed this life at the Gideon Care Center in Gideon, Missouri on July 21, 2009 at the age of 96.

Mr. Leirer graduated from East St. Louis, Illinois High School and then attended Chillicothe Business College in Chillicothe, Missouri.

He started farming in Gideon, Missouri on land that is now the Gideon Memorial Airport.

He served as New Madrid County Farm Reporter, County ASCS Committee Man and Community ASCS Committee man from 1936-1972.

He was Co-founder and Charter Stock-Holder of McCord Gin and serviced as President and Board of Directors Member from 1960-2007, was on Board of Directors for Arbyrd Cotton Cooperation from 1994-2007, was one of the original members of the Gideon United Methodist Church and active in church and Men's group and was a resident of Gideon.

He was united in marriage to Eleanor Sadler on August 5, 1934 in Bernie, Missouri.

Mrs. Leirer preceded her husband in death on November 26, 2006.

Missouri: by five grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

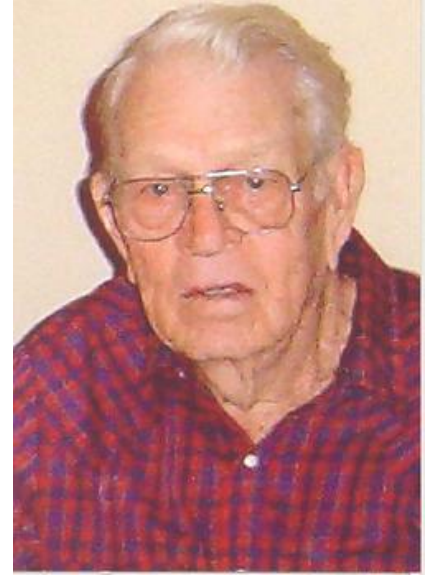
He was preceded in death other than by his parents and his wife by three brothers, Floyd Leirer, Tom Leirer and Gene Leirer.
