Glen A. Tucker, son of the late James A. Tucker and Velma Wicker Tucker, was born on October 13, 1946 at Caruthersville, Missouri and died on April 12, 2010 at the age of 63.

He was an avid hunter for many years and a conservationist of animals and forestry.
