Oshall Lee Warren, the son of the late Rev. John N. Warren and Ertie May Triplett Warren, was born on January 27, 1928 in Essex, Missouri and departed this life at his home in Dexter, Missouri on August 26, 2009.

Oshall was married on December 22, 1951 to Betty Lou Wills Warren and she survives at their home in Dexter.

Oshall was a veteran of the United States Army during the Korean Conflict. His occupations included farming in McGee, MO, developing residential property in the Granite City, IL area and retired from Western Trucking Company in St. Louis, MO.

On July 3rd, 1954, he surrendered his life to his Savior, Jesus Christ. He was called to be a deacon and was ordained in 1961. He served three churches in that capacity. He and his wife also helped plant a mission church in Granite City, IL, which is now called Johnson Road General Baptist Church. He had a deep love for the Bible and taught a Sunday School class most of his adult life. After his retirement, he went on several short-term mission trips to Jamaica and Honduras. He was a mentor and friend to many.
